☐ All lights (headlights, brake lights, indicators) work properly
☐ Tyres have legal tread depth and are evenly worn
☐ No obvious fluid leaks underneath the car
☐ Paint is consistent across panels (no respray evidence)
Interior Condition
☐ Seats, dashboard, and carpets are clean and undamaged
☐ All windows open and close properly
\square Air conditioning, heater, and demister function correctly
☐ Infotainment system (radio, Bluetooth, etc.) works
☐ Warning lights (engine, ABS, airbags) turn off after ignition
Under the Bonnet
☐ Oil levels are clean and filled
□ Coolant is full and looks clear (not murky or rusty)

☐ No visible corrosion on battery terminals
☐ Drive belts and hoses are in good condition (no cracks)
☐ Test Drive
☐ Starts without delay or unusual noise
☐ Brakes feel firm and responsive (no grinding)
☐ Steering is straight (no pulling to one side)
☐ No smoke or hesitation during acceleration
☐ Gears shift smoothly (manual or automatic)
☐ Paperwork and Ownership
☐ Valid registration (check expiry date)
☐ Roadworthy or safety certificate available
☐ Service logbook or receipts present
\square No outstanding finance (verify online or ask for PPSR certificate)
